Did you know that the official name for Dartmouth, is Clifton-Dartmouth-Hardness?

Dartmouth is steeped in maritime history, especially with the triangular trade between Newfoundland and Bordeaux.

It has also been an important and strategic deep water port since the twelfth century in times of war.

We are offering a 1 to 1½ hour walking tour of Dartmouth pointing out the most important buildings and places all within a sensible walking distance.

Although there are believed to be over 10,000 steps in Dartmouth, we do not go up any, only down a few.
